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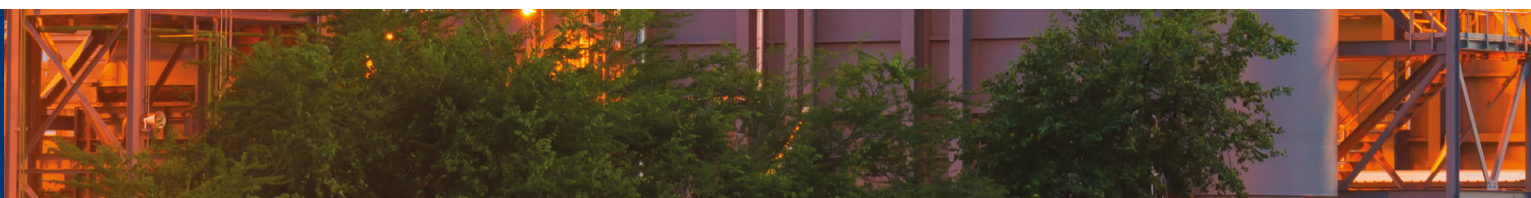

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Petroleum Economist's inaugural Gas-to-Power was a huge success, tackling all of the major issues facing the gas and power markets going forward into an uncertain future.

The first half of the day concentrated on placing gas-to-power in the context of the global energy debate and, particularly, within the energy transition.

The opening keynote and panel session, delivered and then moderated by Andy Brogan of sponsor EY, looked at the changing energy landscape, the relentless pressure to decarbonize and upcoming structural adjustment is on the way.

Issues debated with a lively and involved audience included the uncertainty created by the transition to less carbon intensive fuels and energy sources; the timing of the oil demand peak; pricing in a market where fossil fuel demand is declining; gas as a substitute for coal; its competitiveness over the long-term with renewables and electricity storage; and the investment in cleaner and more flexible production, amid uncertainty about demand and when returns do not match those from traditional hydrocarbons in an investor environment where high returns are demanded.

Three follow-up panels either side of lunch drilled more deeply into specific subjects: where gas-to-power fits in an increasingly renewables-focused world—with contributions from a trader of both gas-fired and renewable power on a daily basis—how changes in the LNG market impact sourcing for gas-to-power and the implications of different supply sources to a gas-fired power project. Again, the panels were characterised by significant levels of audience participation.

The second half of the day switched the focus onto financing of gas-to-power projects. Sponsor Winston & Strawn LLP delivered an excellent keynote, as did Gaffney Cline. Winston & Strawn and fellow sponsor Standard Chartered moderated panels that brought together project experiences from across the globe, including specific examples in North America, Africa, the Middle East and the East Med, including two panellists from coffee break sponsors Energean.

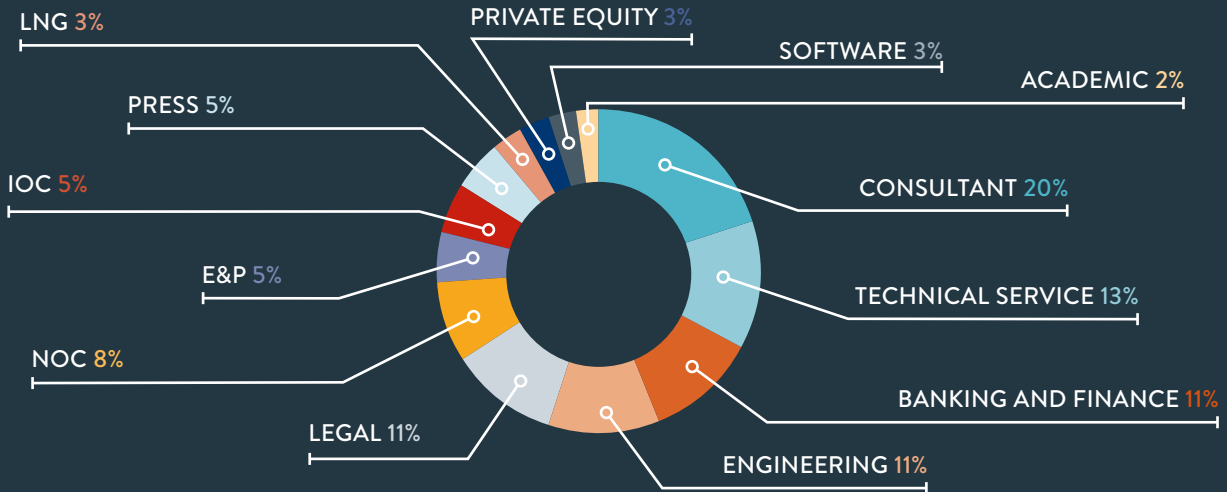

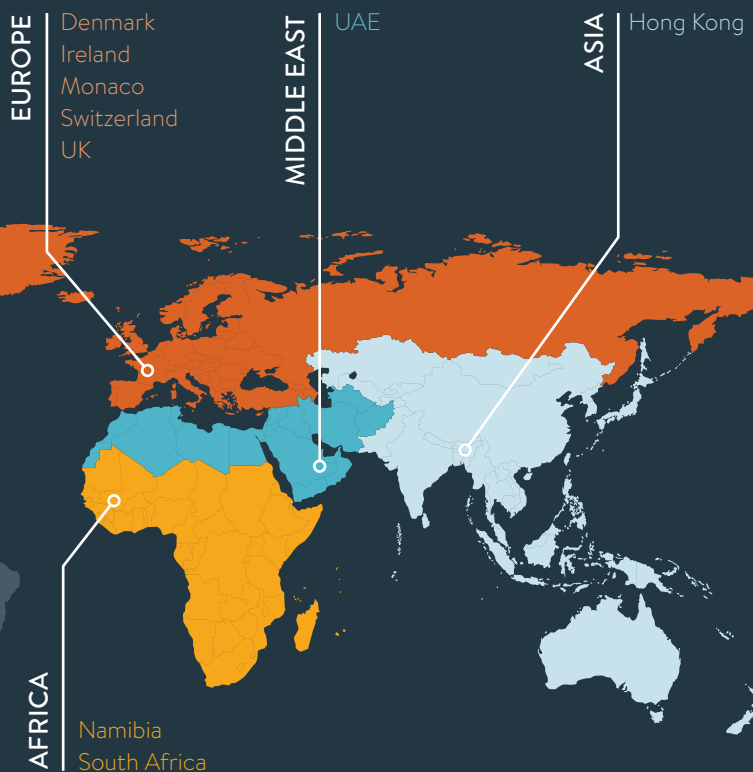
